This is in line with our school's Learning for Life Programme, through which every student is given opportunities for leadership development. Our valedictorian, Ms. Cha Chao Jing personified the theme for Speech Day. She was from the Normal Academic stream in Secondary One, but through her hard work and ardent support from the teachers, she graduated with 7 distinctions in the 'O' Level Examinations in 2013.

Dunearn Secondary School is committed to guiding and supporting each student to reach his/her full potential. Through a student-centric and values-driven approach, the school continues to provide the holistic education that will help our students to achieve high standards in the academic and co-curricular domains.

Academic Matters

students have grown to be more mature and have sharpened their leadership skills and socio-emotional competencies.

At this point, let me provide you with a brief update on activities that have taken place in Term One and our students' achievements.

I am pleased to report that our Uniformed Groups continue to excel, clinching the following awards: NPCC - Unit Overall Proficiency Award (Gold), Scouts - Frank Cooper Sands Award (Gold), NCC - Best Unit Competition (Silver), Boys' Brigade - J M Fraser Award (Bronze), and SJAB - Corps Achievement Award (Bronze).

The school's active effort in environmental education was reaffirmed when we were presented with the Lotus Sustained Achievement Award this year. An example of our school's involvement in environmental programmes with partners includes the event on 25th of February 2014. During that day, a group of students (Environment Champions) and volunteers from the Standard Chartered Bank collaborated to carry out bottle gardening with tree saplings for Bukit Batok Nature Reserve (BBNR).

In February 2014, our Infocomm Club students participated in the Sony's Emerging Youth Excellences (EYES) Competition and did very well to clinch two awards: Merit and 2nd Runner-up.
